What is ABC3?

- ABC3: Action to Build Clinical Confidence and Culture
- Coalition created by IEC in 2021
- Membership includes:
 - Self-advocates
 - Caregivers/partners
 - o Leaders from clinical, disability, and education organizations

- Developed the ABC3 National Roadmap for Disability Inclusive Healthcare

What is the ABC3 Roadmap?

- A plan that clinicians and sectors involved with healthcare can follow to help make healthcare better for people with IDD
- The plan includes:
 - Goals that sectors should set to help clinicians
 - Steps sectors and clinicians can take
 - Ways that sectors can work together to make change happen faster



What are the goals of the ABC3 Roadmap?




- Give clinicians the skills and confidence to care for people with IDD
- Help clinician offices to be welcoming and accessible for people with IDD
- Offer clinicians a place to learn about caring for people with IDD
- Make sure schools and other places that teach new clinicians have classes about caring for people with IDD
- Make sure the rules and guidelines for how clinicians do their jobs include how to best care for people with IDD

SCANS: Long Island Coalition Improving Emergency

Care

- Always Uniquely Me digital app
 - Shares vital information with medical teams
 - Designed for the Emergency Room, but useable at any medical facility
 - Goes beyond medical history and reflects the person with IDD holistically
 - Includes videos, audio, pictures and narrative information
- Environment of Care Disseminating best practices in tools and processes for EDs



What organizations are members of ABC3?

































- IEC identified what role we wanted to have facilitator and amplifier of existing efforts
 - Aimed to avoid duplicating good work
 - Emphasized continuous learning and iterating as we grow
 - Utilized our skills at convening and facilitating groups
- Build community amongst participants personal and professional connections outside of the coalition
 - Aligned on our shared goal of moving this vision forward
 - "We can't do this alone"
- Everyone brough their own unique vision
 - o IEC created a safe space for everyone to share their vision
 - Everyone could envision their role in the ideal end state

Building our Coalition (2 of 2)

- Patience and persistence
 - Balance between doing things in the ideal way and continuing to move forward
- Maintain flexibility in deciding next steps
 - Any step forward gets us toward the same end goal
 - Example: getting unexpected traction in the dental space



How was the Roadmap created?

- Physicians, nurse practitioners, physician associates
- 5 specialty areas:
- Primary care
- Dentistry
- Sexual and reproductive health
- Emergency care
- Mental and behavioral health

Identified clinicians to target first

Created the Clinician Journey

- Centered clinician learning process
- Identified internal and external factors to help move clinicians to learning a lot about IDD and feeling confident in their skills
- Asked about:
- Experiences with people with IDD
- · Training received
- Barriers to learning
- Best methods for teaching
- Key influencers for increasing clinical preparedness

Completed focus groups

Voted on steps that are most crucial for scaled change

- Identified 4 key influential parts of healthcare:
- Professional societies
- Educational associations
- Accrediting and regulatory bodies
- ABC3 coalition and other advocates

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What sectors are included in the Roadmap?

- Education associations
 - △ Set rules for schools where people learn how to be clinicians
- Professional societies
 - Organize and represent certain types of clinicians
- Regulatory bodies
 - Set rules for how clinicians must do their jobs
- Accrediting bodies
 - 🙇 o Make sure clinicians and the places they work follow the rules
- ABC3 Coalition
 - People and organizations who care about making healthcare better for people with IDD

- Power to change things across the United States
- Trusted leaders in the areas they work
- Control how in-training clinicians learn
- Determine how working clinicians do their job
- Set rules and guidelines for all clinicians
